

# **KEYNOTE ADDRESS 9:00 am**

Title: Community Safety and Wellbeing

**Speaker:** Michael T. Dougherty

**Description:** The rise in crime, particularly during the pandemic, caused concerns in communities

throughout Colorado and across the nation. The rise in criminal activity, also, made clear that mental illness, drug addiction and homelessness are three major issues that must be addressed. This presentation will include data and analysis around recent crime trends, including elder abuse. We will discuss the steps that we can take in Boulder County and the work of the District Attorney's Office to ensure a safe community for all, including our

older community members.

**Speaker Bio:** Michael Dougherty is honored to be the District Attorney for the 20th Judicial District

(Boulder County). He has lived in Boulder since moving from Brooklyn in 2010 to oversee the Justice Review Project, an effort to address wrongful convictions in the State of Colorado. Mr. Dougherty started his career as a prosecutor with the Manhattan District Attorney's Office. He is the proud father of 15-year-old twins and is an adjunct professor at CU Law School.

**Speaker Bio:** Desiree is the Community Protection Specialist with the Boulder County District Attorney's

Office, focusing on such topics as consumer protection, resolving issues between consumers and businesses, and engaging and educating the community regarding scams, fraud, and identity theft. Desiree has an MSW from the University of Denver with an emphasis on organizational leadership and policy and a BA from the University of Arizona in Religious Studies.

**Description:** We all have a right to dignity, safety, and security as we age. Join the Boulder County

**Speaker Bio:** Liz works at the Area Agency on Aging as the Coordinator of Boulder County's federal

Abuse in Later Life grant, awarded by the U.S. Department of Justice Office on Violence Against Women. She coordinates training and outreach efforts among law enforcement, the judiciary, agencies serving older adults, and throughout the community. Liz has also worked as the Community Protection Specialist with the Boulder County District Attorney's Office, and practiced law for over 20 years, working on complex commercial litigation,

federal securities fraud, and employment matters.

practices, and common pitfalls.

Title: The Rights Stuff: What is Going on with the Landlord/Tenant

Relationship in Colorado Lately?

**Description:** Lately, Colorado's legislature has passed laws giving tenants more rights in a wide variety

of ways: requiring longer notice for evictions, requiring mediation before evictions, protecting tenants from uninhabitable conditions, and more. As a tenant, are you aware of your new rights — as well as your responsibilities? As a landlord, are you aware of your new responsibilities — as well as your rights? You might be surprised about what the

legislature has been up to.

**Speaker Bio:** Susan has been with City of Longmont for 16 years: she coordinates Longmont Mediation

Services and founded and continues to organize Longmont's monthly Landlord Tenant Training Alliance. She has been mediating in eviction court each Friday since 2004. She is most interested in helping landlords and tenants resolve differences without eviction. Susan graduated from CU Law and has a Masters of Professional Studies, Alternative Dispute Resolution, from DU. After law school, she practiced law in small firm in Broomfield

and clerked for a 20th Judicial District judge.

Title: How to Pick a Lawyer:

Tips and Resources for Trying to Figure Out the Right Attorney-Client Fit

Brett will also address community resources that may be helpful in the attorney search.

Speaker Bio: Brett is the Managing Attorney of Colorado Legal Services - Boulder. She received her BA

from Carleton College and her J.D. from the University of Oregon. Brett worked with the Domestic Violence Clinic in Eugene, OR after graduation and later worked for Legal Aid Services of Oregon in Klamath Falls, OR. Brett also practiced family law with the law firm Warren, Carlson & Moore in Niwot, CO. She serves on the Access to Justice committee and

is a Past President of the Boulder County Bar Association.
